CITY SEEKS PUBLIC COMMENTS ON TRANSPORTATION ROUTES AT APRIL 28 GENERAL PLAN UPDATE MEETING

MADERA, CA – Residents are encouraged to attend an upcoming General Plan Update Steering Committee meeting to discuss the Circulation Element of the General Plan. The meeting will take place at the Frank A. Bergon Senior Center, April 28, at 6:30 p.m.

The Circulation Element focuses on the location and extent of major streets, current and future transportation routes, public transit terminals and public utilities in the City. The Element will also include policies to support walking, bicycling, and public transportation to implement the City's Vision 2025 Plan.

The Circulation Element will be closely coordinated with the Land Use Element of the General Plan. Also in keeping with the Vision 2025 Plan, the Land Use Element is expected to encourage land uses that will make it easier for Madera residents to walk and bike to schools, parks, and shopping.

Participating in this meeting is a great way for residents to learn about circulation and to provide input on important issues like funding existing and future roadways, reducing future traffic congestion, the effects of vehicle emissions on the City.
